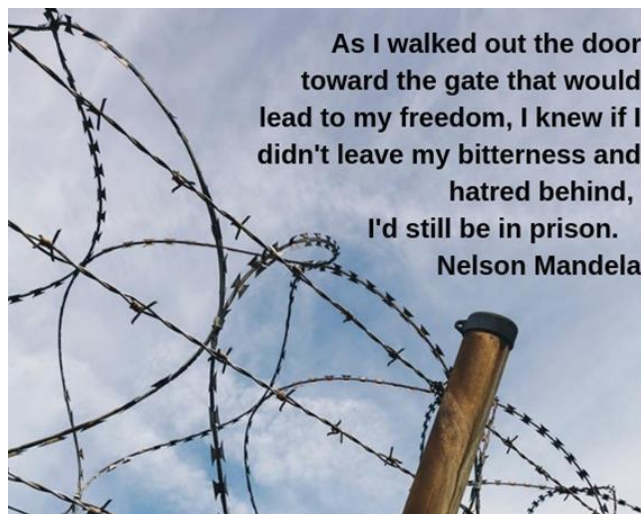

MESSAGE FROM THE (ACTING) PRESIDENT

Dear VUU Family,

Our four new board members have already attended a board orientation and shared the last board meeting of the year with the outgoing team. Because we were not able to all be together this month, the new board voted to elect our officers next month; the current officers will maintain their duties through our next meeting at the end of July.

As a reminder, the newly elected board members are Debbie Grande, Joan Bundy, and Linda Stenholm. Sue Keen was appointed by the board to fill a one-year board member opening vacated by Paul Schneider. I was reelected to a third term, and Bob Fabre and Musette Steger continue with the second year of their current terms.

My thanks go out to Paul Schneider, Karl Hurst-Wicker, Maria Dixon, and Mary Erickson, who have each made outstanding contributions to the board and been committed to the mission of VUU. I would say you'll be missed, but we are sure to see you both in attendance and taking up new roles over time.

Two weeks ago, I spent four days in Spokane, Washington with 2,700 Unitarian Universalists at the annual General Assembly of the UUA. Three other members and Rev. Kellie Walker Hart were there as well, and we all enjoyed the fellowship and learning opportunities. I was fortunate to catch up with friends from two of my former UU congregations; what fun that was! Our VUU group explored the riverside, ate some good food, and attended several worship services and learning sessions at the convention center.

We can report that the UUA is on the bleeding edge of facing “White Supremacy Culture,” not just in the greater community, but within our association and congregations. Whether or not you appreciate the chosen naming convention -- many do, and many of us are very unsure or do not -- it is clear that much is being done to look inward and not just outside, to confront and dismantle oppression that has consumed our culture from its inception. We are asked to center marginalized people – of color, indigenous, LGBTQ, women, and various socio-economic classes – in our decision making, in our worship, and in our leadership, with intention and with urgency.

You probably have heard, and surely will hear more, about this as things unfold within the denomination. What we can be sure of among ourselves is our commitment to our vision, and to our Ends Statements. The Board realized last week while discussing them that we do not remind ourselves and each other often enough of these words we chose to describe what we want to become. So, I've asked that they be included in this newsletter. And I ask that you reread them and think about how we move forward each day in this work we have chosen to do together.

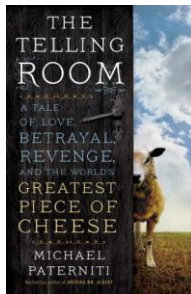
An opportunity to learn from the Dalai Lama and other modern Buddhist teachers is offered each Sunday. The program is offered in 2 parts:

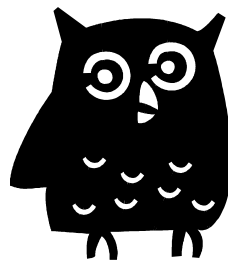

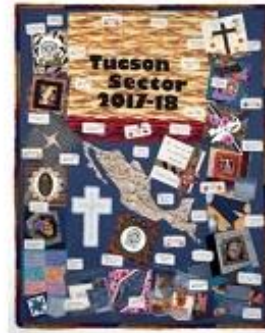
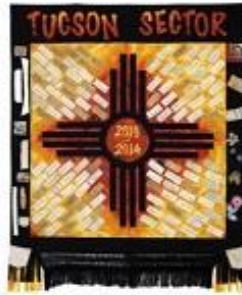

Capital Campaign

Our congregational vision for the Capital Campaign is to raise funds for capital improvements to support four (4) main goals: a more family-friendly environment, more meeting spaces, improved facilities to support our mission and programs, and to unify our VUU community. Together we are making this vision reality.

The leadership portion of the campaign began in April and will continue over the summer. At the Congregational Meeting, the CCC was thrilled to report that pledges as of June 3rd exceeded \$800,000, and there were still a significant number of potential leadership donors to canvass. We are very encouraged by this progress and optimistic about reaching our campaign target of \$2.5 million.

In the next few months, additional stewards for the general campaign will be recruited and trained. The general campaign will take place this fall in tandem with VUU's annual stewardship campaign (operating pledge). The Endowment Report



In 2015 an extraordinary storm hit the VUU campus. The volume of rain was labeled a 100-year flood. And our property damage, especially to the school rooms, was extensive. We had no choice but to pay for repairs, but we had no plan or source of cash to pay them. Ideally a congregation would have a “savings account” for such urgent cash flow needs. Fortunately, we had some money available in our Special Funds endowment. But even then, the cash on hand was barely enough.

Following that event, the congregation made a concerted effort to build a reserve fund into our budgets. This could be used for an emergency like the flood, or other major crises, like a couple air conditioning units failing at the same time and requiring substantial cash urgently. Each of the past three year's annual budgets have included \$10,000 toward this purpose.

It is with pleasure that the Special Funds committee reports one final grant for the 2018-19 fiscal year. Out of the \$16,754 that was determined to be available for granting this year, Special Funds has allocated the balance of \$4,254 toward the VUU operating reserve fund. More will still be needed over time. It is best practice to build such a fund to equal 3-6 months of the total operating budget. But together with the diligent planning of several years, we are now better positioned for any urgent expense than ever before.

Oh, and one note of caution: Monsoon season officially started on June 15th.

Hosting Asylum Seeking Refugees, June Report

Our thanks again to everyone who donated, cooked, cleaned, sorted, played with children, drove our guests to the airport or bus depot, who translated, but mostly, thank you to you who loved and treated our refugee guests with dignity and respect. Love is a verb; we are called to serve!

Our next host date will be July 17. Watch for more info and sign-up forms next week. We will continue to collect items we need. Please bring them with you to the Service and leave them in basket marked 'HOSTING' in the Sanctuary Foyer area.

We need new children's – boys and girls - underwear, all sizes. Women's sports bras, sizes medium & large. Baby, toddler, teen and pre-teen clothes. We especially need girls' leggings for 5-year-old to 15-year-old girls.

We need Tylenol – infant and adult types.

Diapers – all sizes except size 4; baby food, powdered milk, baby formula – we sometimes don't know what type of formula or what size diapers we will need until the day our guests arrive so financial donations for these things are very helpful.

We still need car seats for toddlers – booster seat types and up-right types.

There are also some volunteer opportunities *between* our hostings. We will need to sort clothing, shoes, etc. before every hosting. If you'd like to be contacted when these times are scheduled, call or text Rebekah at 443-890-5387.

We are also sharing sleeping mats with other congregations hosting in the Tempe/Chandler area. These mats need to be loaded/moved and then returned between hostings. If you have a pick-up truck and a buddy with a pick-up truck, you two could have the privilege of becoming the sleeping mat moving team! You could do this on a day/time that works for you! Requirements

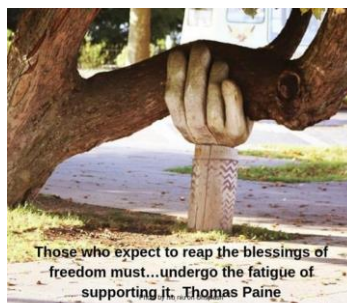
