

The choir is providing a lunch potluck at 12:30 with a short vocal workshop with Jill Khaleghi at 1:15, free to those purchasing a workshop ticket.

STREET REQUIEM: This fantastic new piece will be the focus of our annual All-Music Services this year, scheduled for March 18th at the UU Congregation of Phoenix and March 25th at the VUU Sunday morning service. This year there will also be an additional performance at Tempe First United Methodist Church, 215 E. University Dr., Tempe, on Sunday April 8th at 3 PM. Written in honor and memory of those who live and die on the streets, we hope to have some of our interfaith partners and I-HELP clients participate by singing with us or attending this community concert.

STREET REQUIEM uses traditional text from the musical form of the Catholic mass, along with more modern language and musical styles ranging from Celtic to South African to pop. Through these performances we hope to bring attention to issues related to homelessness and what resources are being used to address current needs (such as the I-HELP program, which VUU hosts in our sanctuary on most Monday evenings).

The CHALICE SINGERS (VUU's Children's Choir) has started rehearsing again on Wednesday evenings from 6:15 p.m. to 7 p.m. in the sanctuary kitchen. Open to kids K through about 6th grade, they sing for the Sunday morning service about once a month and practice through mid-May. Please contact me (Rev. VOICES LIFTED SINGERS is a group of women who sing in community settings such as nursing homes and at bedside for those recovering from surgery or illness or who are in hospice care. Women4Women Tempe was one of the organizations that the offering went to from the Thanksgiving Interfaith service, held at Valley UU this past November. Their mission is to provide bags containing feminine hygiene products to homeless and low-income women. They believe these items should be available to those who need them, and that women shouldn't have to choose between perhaps buying food or these necessities.



The Gilded Age Meets Downton Abbey.

Cora, of Downton Abbey fame, is the inspiration for this journey. She was based on the American heiresses who arrived in England during the late 1800s and married for love or to rescue a great estate in distress. We will focus on some of these heiresses, while we explore their homes and visit Downton Abbey film sites. Highclere Castle was the home of heiress Lady Almina Carnarvon, and was also used as the fictional home of Cora. American Consuelo Vanderbilt married the 9th Duke of Marlborough and saved Blenheim Palace with her fortune. Another heiress, Jennie Jerome, married the 8th Duke of Marlborough's brother, and gave birth to Winston Churchill there. The great-grandmother of Diana the Princess of Wales, was an American Heiress and the future kings of England are her descendants.

We'll stay for 5 nights in my favourite English city, Oxford - the unique university town of amazing bookstores, unusual architecture, historic pubs, and eclectic free museums.
