“A Moment with the Minister”



I’ve asked a lot of people over the years why they choose to be part of a congregation. For some, it’s about a meditative connection with the holy, for others the music is key, and a handful of folks even enjoy the sermons. One person was surprisingly candid, answering that they were mostly looking for a spouse. But by far the majority of people talk about their desire to be in community.

Community is something we religious liberals do well. It’s true that religion is in some ways a damaged brand these days. However, when it is free from hatred and fear, religion is just as important as ever. We are (I hope) at the tail end of an era in which institutions were weakened by cynicism and lack of participation. We have fewer places in which people can gather to cooperatively solve their problems. Our faith homes are filling this vacuum. I think this is why communities like Valley Unitarian Universalist are growing. As the UU hymn says, we have found a need to be together.

So we sing and pray together. We learn and play and work for justice together. We share meals and hugs and care for one another when life gets the better of a member of our community.

But it isn’t just any community we are at work building at VUU, and it doesn’t stop at our doors. Ours is a vision of *beloved* community, the term made famous by Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Here is a description of that community, from the King Center: “Dr. King’s Beloved Community is a global vision in which all people can share in the wealth of the earth. In the Beloved Community, poverty, hunger and homelessness will not be tolerated because international standards of human decency will not allow it. Racism and all forms of discrimination, bigotry and prejudice will be replaced by an all-inclusive spirit of sisterhood and brotherhood.”

This vision is our north star. It sets our course as a congregation, even as we know we will never quite reach it in our lifetimes.

This month as we reflect together on Beloved Community, we will dig deeper into Dr. King’s thinking on the topic. We will explore the wide welcome cast in Beloved Community and talk about times when conflict happens in our faith homes. It’s quite a tall order, this building Beloved Community. But you and I are just the people to do it.

BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

Dear friends of VUU,

This week the VUU board of trustees and staff met with *Wendell Burnette Architects* to review initial proposals for campus upgrades. As we reviewed initial sketches, the architects did a wonderful job of showing how the upgrades could address many of the concerns from the feedback from our visioning sessions this past month. Thank you all that participated in the visioning sessions and provided input to this process. I personally was moved by what I saw and how it provided opportunities for us to really grow into the vision that we together have put together over the past few years.

For our next steps in the visioning process, we will have another review of the initial sketches with the VUU leadership team with a goal of identifying an option that best represents all the feedback from the congregation. The architects will then spend the next 6 weeks to build a digital 3-D rendering of how the campus could look and the interactions of members and guests. We will review this presentation with the congregation at our annual meeting on June 3rd. We can then decide as a congregation to move forward with a feasibility study and capital campaign. This is a very exciting time and I hope that you will join us at the annual meeting for this as well as our normal agenda items including final budget approval for next year, financial status review, special funds, and elections. We will also have a congregational conversation May 20th to preview much of this information and hope that you can also attend this meeting.

Our financial status continues to be very positive as we have seen higher than expected revenues from contributions over the past couple months. Our year-end projection now shows a significant surplus if we continue with expected income and expenses through May and June. This is great news and gives us an opportunity to fund even further budget line items for next year and also provides some financial comfort as we decide to take that next step in improving our campus.

Again—I hope you can make it to the congregational conversation and annual meetings mentioned above to do the important business we need to move into our next fiscal year.

On TRANSFORMATION: By the time you read this, we have just finished our monthly Touchstones Theme of Transformation and started to work on the theme of Beloved Community. How appropriate, then, for me to talk about my own journey of transformation and how it affects this wonderful VUU community.

Many of you know that my first husband, Russ, died in March 2012 after living with two illnesses, a chronic one, Parkinson's Disease, and then a more acute one, stomach cancer. Our three children were 21, 19, and 14 at the time. I've been taking mostly baby steps since then to create a new life, slowly figuring out a way to honor and integrate the past while moving into a different life still filled with joy and meaning. On Valentine's Day, 2015 many of you celebrated with James and me as we took a joyful leap into the future and danced the night away at our wedding in the VUU sanctuary.

And now many of the baby steps I've taken are creating another giant leap forward! For a year and a half, I've explored a number of new personal and professional growth options. These included welcoming new family members and learning more about Mexican culture through my middle son's marriage, doing some consulting work in music ministry, doing advanced training in worship design, considering some serious out-of-state job possibilities, fantasizing about running a bed and breakfast or taking early retirement, returning to playing the piano more, supporting James as he re-trained as a bicycle coach and got back into mountain bike racing, and transforming our backyard into an edible garden paradise.

Valley UU is currently undergoing it's own transformation as it looks at a possible Capital Campaign to meet our growing space and ministry needs, and as we go to two services for part of the year, starting in October. After looking at the Board's main goals and having many conversations with Rev. Andy, I have decided to continue to focus on my main areas of Music and Worship Ministries, while lending staff support as needed to our re-forming Membership Team. I will continue to work 3/4's time, which has been the level I've been at happily for over 10 years. But I will consolidate most of my work on three full days: Sundays, Mondays, and Tuesdays. We will keep our house in Tempe but at least half of the week I will spend in Prescott with James, where we have found our dream house and he will develop his cycle coaching business. Adult Choir rehearsals will move to Tuesday evenings starting in August, with the Chalice Singers also likely moving to that time.

I have noticed that most successful long-term ministries blossom best when the employee has been able to reinvent themselves several times over the years, and when the congregation has also been able to learn and grow and change. This is one of those exciting times! I thank you for your continued love and support and look forward to the next phase in our congregational life. I particularly thank my colleagues Andy, Sue, Marci, and Jill for their support, as I've taken both small steps and large leaps of transformation.

I welcome your questions/ideas/thoughts as we move ahead with these exciting changes!

BOARD OF TRUSTEES



Paul Schneider (incumbent & current President)

My family and I have been members of VUU since 2010 when we were introduced to Unitarian Universalism for the first time. Since then I have volunteered in RE by assistant teaching the middle school class and participating in the worship band. I was also the membership committee chair for 2 years and was engaged in the Leap of Faith program with our mentor First Universalist Church of Denver and learned about congregational growth and UU organization as a whole. I have been on the Board of Trustees for the last four years, currently serving as board president. I have not only enjoyed learning and growing with the board, but I have also become much more connected to our mission. I would like to continue with another term with the board to help maintain consistency through our current visioning process and to help in the next phase of implementing potential campus changes. Outside of VUU I am an engineer at a large company here in the valley. Bob Fabre (incumbent)
