

The CPC hopes you've had a chance to look at the new rendering we've been displaying on the patio before and after Sunday services. **Oasis Town Square Option 3A.1**, created by Wendell Burnette Architects in consultation with the CPC, shows what we hope can be accomplished with monies now being pledged to the Capital Campaign.

The Endowment Report - June 2019

The markets have been up and down this year, wavering with each capricious tweet from Washington, yet the mix of funds and indices selected by the historical Special Funds advisors has proven to be resilient. As of mid-May, our VUU total account fund balance stands at just over \$435,000. This fiscal year (2018-2019), the total allowable grants from the fund are set at \$16,754. And to date we have made grants of \$12,500 for programs from leadership training, guest ministers and the Coming of Age program. There still remains approximately \$4,250 available for grants, with any unspent portion of that retained in the fund for long-term growth. The allowable allocation for the coming year will be set based upon our balance on June 30, 2019.


